**NOTICE
OF RACE**
(OFFSHORE)

1 RULES

- 1.1 The races shall be governed by the rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) of World Sailing (WS), Special Regulations of Australian Sailing (AS), the current IRC rule (parts A, B & C) where applicable, the ORC Rule where applicable, the class rules of each class, all as modified by the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 Yachts sailing in IRC Division(s) shall comply with the current IRC Rules Parts A, B and C.
- 1.3 RRS 52 is amended to permit powered winches for boats over 14m LOA.
- 1.4 Boats not racing in IRC shall request permission from the Race Committee to use movable and/ or variable ballast for the purpose of increasing stability. Any such request must be accompanied by full details of the system involved, and any such system will be considered in establishing the yacht's handicap. Stored power may be used for the operation of moveable ballast systems. RRS 51 and 52 are modified to the extent of this paragraph.
- 1.5 Protest arbitration may be used as per RRS Appendix T.

2 DIVISIONS / CLASSES

- 2.1 The event will be sailed in separate classes as follows:

Class / Event	Description	Handicap System
TP52 Gold Cup	Offshore TP52 Class	IRC, TPR
Division 1	Offshore	IRC, PHS, ORC club
Division 2	Offshore Cruising	PHS, ORC club

- 2.2 The Organising Authority (OA) may alter, amalgamate, or divide any Division and may add classes as required. The OA may cancel any Division if fewer than six (6) entries have been received by the closing date. In this event, yachts that have entered will have the option of transferring to another Division (if eligible) or having their entry fee refunded.

3 ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 All competing entrants shall be single hull and self-righting, be built in accordance with AS Special Regulations part 1, section 3.03.1 and have a LOA not less than 9 metres.
- 3.2 The owner of a vessel entered in the SailFest Newcastle Regatta shall hold a marine legal liability insurance policy with respect to the yacht, current when racing, with an adequate sum insured of not less than AUD\$10 million (or its equivalent in another currency). The policy will state that the yacht is covered for races in which it is participating or that it is covered for races of a length greater than the length of the race in which it is participating. The policy shall be in effect throughout the regatta.
- 3.3 IRC entrants shall hold a valid IRC rating certificate during the regatta. Yachts shall submit a copy of their certificate prior to the commencement of racing, and no alteration to the certificate will be permitted after that time except as a result of a rating protest, or to correct rating errors.

4 SAFETY

- 4.1 Category 4 of the AS Special Regulations Part 1 shall apply for all participating yachts.
- 4.2 Each participating yacht shall maintain an accurate Crew List within the Topyacht Entry System. For further guidance see the help page - <https://www.ncyc.net.au/resources/>

5.3 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the OA accompanied by a \$20 Late Entry Fee.

8.2 A boats series score shall be the total of all her race scores. No drops will apply. This changes RRS Appendix A.

- 10.1 By lodging an entry, the owner agrees to be bound by the rules and conditions of this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.
- 10.2 By lodging an entry, the owner acknowledges:
All those participating in the series do so at their own risk and responsibility. Competitors must acknowledge this prior to participating and release the NCYC and its sponsors and their respective officers, employees, volunteers, and members from all liability by completing the online registration form as a part of the entry process. Specific attention is drawn to RRS Fundamental Rule 4, which states: *"The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone"*
- 10.3 By participating in the event, participants give the absolute right and permission for any photographs and/or video footage of the yacht and crew to be published in any media for any editorial, publicity or advertising purposes.

11 PRIZES

- 11.1 Prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place overall in each Division for IRC, PHS, & TP52.
- 11.2 Additional Prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 11.3 Prizes will be presented at the Closing Ceremony following the final race on Sunday 27th March 2022.

12 BERTHING

- 12.1 Berthing may be booked free of charge by visiting, competing yachts for the duration of the event including the nights of:
- Friday, 25th March 2022
 - Saturday, 26th March 2022
 - Sunday, 27th March 2022
